

Nachusa Grasslands Prescribed Fire Crew Summary Report

For fires completed from Fall 2012 through Spring 2013

We burned 1,800-acres with a spring that was more like winter. We burned two days in November, one day in December, four days in March, and five days in April. That is only twelve burn days. The fire season may last for weeks but the available days are few. There were several units we did not get to.




First fire in the Orland Prairie north "Panhandle".

What we learned and relearned:

- Carpe diem ignis. "Seize the fire day". You want to have your crews out burning on every day that the weather is safe and the vegetation is ready to burn. This means getting your equipment loaded and functioning before fire season begins. For us this is late October and then in late February. Communicate up your chain of command the importance of having few meetings, events, and other work due during fire season.
- **Empower volunteers.** Our fire crews are primarily volunteers. They are treated as colleagues with the training and tools to get the job done. A special call out to Dave Crites, John Heneghan, and Mike Carr who again prepared and maintained our fire equipment. Also to the folks who came out for lots of fires. They make a big difference.
- Mentor others. Established fire crews need to reach out to other agencies, non-profits, and
 private landowners and actively mentor folks towards getting fire on their ground. We have had
 a number of successes in this regard.

- Rock River Prescribed Fire Crew. This fire crew did well this spring with Damian Considine as its cooridinator, and Greg Hunter caring for the fire equipment. They burned several units. The Rock River Fire Crew is comprised of volunteers from the region working to help landowners and agencies get fires done. They have their own safety gear and fire equipment.
- Build in redundancy. Have more than the minimum of crew. Have a water tender to fill up
 pumps quickly. We have a plethora of water sprayers, pumpers, that we have gathered over the
 years. If you have a truck or utility vehicle sitting empty you might put a water sprayer in the
 bed. We use piston or diaphram pumps that produce high pressure (300 to 400 psi) and use
 only 10 gallons per minute. This produces an efficient sprayer for Midwest fuels.
